1. Introduction

Stratford Town Council adopted Imagine Stratford - Towards a Vision for 2028, a Community Sustainability Plan for the Town of Stratford, in September of 2008. One of the components of the plan is the inclusion of a decision making framework which is designed to ensure that the Town moves continuously towards a more sustainable future. The decision making framework contains a set of questions in the broad areas of economic, environmental, social, cultural and governance which are designed to measure the overall sustainability of the decision. In order to ensure the proper and efficient application of the decision making framework, an application checklist is required. There is also an Operational Plan Policy (2004-FA-02) that requires the impact of Operational and Capital spending decisions to be quantified. It is deemed prudent to include these requirements in the sustainability decision making framework checklist to avoid duplication of effort.

2. Decision Making Framework Application Checklist

The following sustainability decision making framework checklist shall be used to determine when the decision making framework is to be completed and submitted. It is the responsibility of each Department Head to ensure that this policy is followed. For the purpose of this policy, the following terms shall be defined as:

"Service" includes any service that the Town provides to residents and businesses including police, fire, street lighting, snow clearing, water supply, sewer collection etc.

"Program" includes sport, recreation, cultural, social, economic and sustainability programs provided to and for residents and businesses.

"Event" includes community, recreation, cultural, social, economic, or tourism events coordinated or sponsored by the Town, possibly in partnership with outside organizations.

3. Additional Application of the Decision Making Framework

In addition to the above checklist, the following shall be reviewed and assessed against the decision making framework and modified or replaced as necessary:

- all Town bylaws in existence at the effective date of this policy shall be reviewed and assessed within 10 years of the effective date of this policy;
- all Town policies in existence at the effective date of this policy shall be reviewed and assessed within 10 years of the effective date of this policy;
- all operational and maintenance practices shall be reviewed and assessed at regular intervals of no greater than 15 years.

Also, the Town's purchasing policy shall be revised to incorporate the principles embodied in the decision making framework for the purchase of goods and services which do not require the application of the decision making framework in the above table. Tenders and Requests for Proposals shall also incorporate the principles embodied in the decision making framework.

4. Effective Date

The effective date of this policy is January 1, 2009.

5. Adoption of Modified Sustainability Decision Making Framework

The attached Sustainability Decision Making Framework, which has been modified to incorporate the principles of the Operational Plan Policy, shall be hereby adopted and applied in accordance with this policy.

6. Repeal of Existing Policy

Operational Plan Policy, Policy # 2004-FA-02, is hereby repealed.
