### MAYOR'S MESSAGE





Looking back over the past several months, Council and I have been busy working to make Stratford the best community possible. We are very pleased to report that the 2019-20 budget has been completed with no tax increase although it was very challenging to do. Going forward we will be discussing with the new provincial government a model to achieve fair and predictable funding which recognizes Stratford's unprecedented growth rate and the resulting need to provide programs, services and infrastructure in the fastest growing town on PEI.

I am very proud to report that the new Emergency Services Facility is progressing well and is on track to be operational later this year. Applications for federal and provincial funding for all major Town capital projects have been submitted, including a proposal for a multi-use facility and our fingers are crossed that we will receive positive response to these applications over the summer!

A lot of development activity continues in the Town this year. One of our major challenges is to balance construction with maintaining quality of life for residents and appropriate environmental protection. Staff, Council and I are fully cognizant of these important considerations and are working with developers, the Stratford Area Watershed Improvement Group (SAWIG) and provincial authorities to ensure appropriate measures are put in place and respected.

The Town is particularly focused at this time on increasing affordable housing within Stratford and promoting sustainable subdivision developments. We have been working with developers, the Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation, the Atlantic Canada Opportunities Agency, and others to move forward on affordable housing initiatives. Council has approved a property tax rebate and other incentives to encourage developers to undertake affordable housing initiatives.

As a valuable part of our growth, the Town continues to welcome newcomers who add so much to the texture and richness of the social and economic fabric of Stratford. With many ongoing measures in place, we are also pursuing funding for infrastructure to ensure all residents, both new and long-term, feel connected to our community, are able to mark cultural special occasions and are included in all Town events and activities.

Staff, Council and I are looking forward to the summer and especially to one of the highlights of the season: Stratford's celebration of our great country on July 1st. There will be music, cultural and artistic displays, bouncy castles, food, refreshments and, of course, ice cream scooped and served personally by your Mayor and Councillors. Hope to see you there!

Enjoy a fun, safe and relaxing summer in Stratford!

### INFRASTRUCTURE DEPARTMENT

### > Utility Projects

The Utility is currently extending sewer and water services on Michael Thomas Way along the waterfront. This project began in May and is expected to be completed by mid-July. In April, the Town of Stratford applied for provincial funding to complete several Utility projects over the next two years but will not have confirmation on project approvals until the fall. Depending on the timing, we will hope to have this information for our September Town Talk.

### > Waste Water Delivery System

This project has been tendered in 6 phases. At the time of writing this we are awaiting tender prices on the phase of work across the bridge span. When these tenders are received the Utility will determine how the numbers fit into the overall project budget and, if within budget, the plan is to complete the first five phases in 2019 and the final phase in 2020.

### > New Developments

There have been several subdivision developments that the Utility has provided comment on but a final decision has not been made yet by developers whether construction will take place this year.

### > Water Metering

Water metering continues to be well received by most residents. While we wait for a vear's worth of data to be able to make a determination on overall potential reductions in water use, we are pleased with the initial indications we are seeing. We remind residents to monitor their own household use and to regularly check their own water meters to ensure that no leaks have started. If the water tap icon on the meter is flashing or staying on, begin by investigating potential leaking toilets and taps in the home. Leaking toilets are the number one reason for increased water consumption and unchecked (unknown) leaks can increase quarterly bills by hundreds of dollars if a toilet is leaking continuously. We also encourage residents to install low flow toilets and faucets. At the time of writing,

our toilet rebate program remains open but is limited on a first come basis. Visit www.townofstratford.ca for more information. Generally residents tend to use more water in the summer months so please be water conscious and continue to monitor your water meters.

#### > Storm Water Infiltration

Staff are in the process of installing 500 water catch trays under our sewer manhole covers. These trays are designed to keep a large percentage of storm water out of the sewer system which normally contributes to overloading our waste water treatment plant. Please note that in accordance with the Town's bylaw it is illegal to discharge any storm water, surface water, roof run-off, surface drainage, subsurface drainage, foundation drainage or water used for heating or cooling into our sewer system. This includes sump pumps. If you have any questions please contact us at (902) 569-4662.

#### > Public Works

#### Maintenance

Staff have completed cleanup around our properties and are now busy with sidewalk cleaning, grass cutting, installing temporary speed humps, maintaining trails, and other regular and seasonal duties.

#### Crosswalks

Crosswalk flags were installed on the Bunbury Road at the Horton Drive/Bunbury Mall crosswalk and at Cotton Park crosswalk, and more recently by the Bunbury/Mason Road intersection. Another set is installed on the Stratford Road at Southport Drive. Pedestrians should simply take a flag from the holder and wave it until traffic has stopped in both directions, then cross the street and place the flag in the holder on the other side of the crosswalk. A new crosswalk, with flags, will also be installed this summer on Kinlock Road by JK Beauty Lane.

#### Trails

New trails will be installed this year from Calloway Close to Creekside Drive and from Williams Gate to the existing park and bike trails will be constructed in

Fullerton's Creek Conservation Park. We are also exploring adding more temporary trail routes to allow us to join subdivisions and make our trail system more fluid. These trails are typically installed on private property with the landowners' permission. As they are temporary, these trails may be grassed, wooded, graveled or wood chipped until the final location is determined. We appreciate these landowners working with the Town to enhance our active transportation system.

### > Speed Signs

In our ongoing effort to reduce speeding in Stratford, the Town recently purchased six new speed radar signs which you will see located throughout Stratford this year. These signs will provide data to our Safety Services Committee to determine if there is in fact speeding, and if so, is it a significant overall speeding issue or refined to a few drivers in particular areas. If you observe speeding in our community, please contact the RCMP with as much detail as possible about the driver, vehicle and location.

### Mason Road Roundabout Stratford Emergency Services Facility (ESF)

Work is taking place on these two projects at the same time. The Emergency Services Faciliy is coming together quite nicely as the framework has been erected and contractors are working on the exterior finish. The work schedule was interrupted this winter with the frequent snow and cold temperatures but as the weather warms we expect contractors to catch up to the scheduled timelines and look forward the ESF opening later this year.

The Province of PEI is continuing with construction on the new roundabout at the intersection of the Mason Road and the Trans Canada Highway. This project involves realigning the entrance and exits to the roundabout from Hollis Avenue, Mason Road, Georgetown Road and Dale Drive. Work is planned to be completed in late 2019.

### > Town Roads Street & Ditch Infilling

All roads, streets and ditches in Stratford are owned by the Province of PEI. Provincial crews are already cleaning up from winter snowplow, salt and storm water damage. They are also busy patching potholes and installing or replacing culverts. Please note that any request to infill your ditch or replace a culvert should be directed to the Provincial Department of Highways.

#### Notice – Encroachment on Town Lands

The Town of Stratford has recently noticed, during routine inspections, that some property owners are encroaching on Town-owned properties. These encroachments may include:

- Buildings/Garages/Sheds (including those attached to a dwelling and/or fence)
- Fences
- · Walkways and driveways
- Structures (decks, stairs, patios, planters etc.).
- · Fill, berms, and retaining walls
- · Swimming pools and hot tubs
- Shrubs, trees, gardens or other organic landscape materials
- Signs

These encroachments may restrict public access and enjoyment of Town lands and/or the Town's ability to maintain effective services. The Town will therefore be undertaking a program to mark the boundary lines between Town land and private property, with the placement of decorative posts/rope and/or trees and hedges, to ensure that further encroachments are minimized. We will also be directly contacting property owners who have encroached on Town land to remedy these occurrences. We understand that most of these encroachments were not intended and we appreciate the cooperation of property owners as we work through this process.

### > The Building Bylaw and National Building Code

In the spring of 2011, the Town of Stratford adopted the 2010 National Building Code of Canada (NBCC) through the creation of a new Building Bylaw. The Building Bylaw is enforced through scheduled inspections during construction at various stages of completion. These inspections will verify work against the approved submitted plans and against the NBCC.

Any new application for development shall require the following:

- Application Form
- Floor Plans
- Elevations
- · Cross-sections
- Site Plan
- Utility Form
- Deposit
- Entrance Permit
- Truss Package
- Drainage Plan (see below)
- Applicant Authorization (see below)

The Planning Department also requires a grading plan to be submitted for new development. This grading plan should be developed by a surveyor, professional engineer, or another qualified person. It should indicate the existing grade of the property, the elevation of the tops of foundations of adjacent structures, the ditch, the street, and the proposed top of elevation of the proposed development as well as the proposed flow of run-off once construction is complete.

If the person making an application for development is not the property owner, they must submit an Applicant Authorization Letter, in which the property owner identifies the authorized agent whom shall represent them on their behalf.

To ensure that your permit is ready in time for your project start date, please submit your complete application as early as possible.

A copy of the Building Bylaw, Application Forms, and Fee Schedule can be found on the Town's website (www.townofstratford.ca) or you can pick up copies in person from the Town of Stratford Planning Department, located within Stratford Town Centre. ### > Development Permits

To date 2019 has been an above-average year in terms of active development processing which continues to keep staff very busy. Since January of this year the Planning Department have issued a total of 38 development permits.

### PLANNING, DEVELOPMENT AND HERITAGE

### > Deck Permit Requirements

Before commencing work on a deck project, you must make a development permit application to the Town of Stratford Planning Department. Applications are only accepted once all required documentation is submitted and the deposit is paid.

Required documentation includes:

- Application Form
- Letter of Authorization (if applicant is not the landowner)
- Site Plan, drawn to scale indicating:
  - Lot dimensions
  - Dimensions of all existing and proposed buildings and structures on the lot;
  - Setbacks of all existing and proposed buildings and Structures;
- Building Plans, drawn to scale, indicating:
  - Dimensions of structure;
  - Spacing and size of all structural members (joists, beams, posts, footings, etc.)
- · Application fee: \$50

Development permits are only issued if they meet the requirements of the Town of Stratford's bylaws and when all applicable fees are paid in full. The permits are valid for a 24 month period, and are normally issued within seven (7) to ten (10) business days.

A copy of the Application Forms, Fee Schedule, and other relevant documents can be found on the Town's website (www.TownofStratford.ca) or you can pick up copies in person at the Town of Stratford Planning Department. ### > Pool Permits are Mandatory

Swimming pools require a development permit to ensure safety measures are being applied. Any pool having a depth of 60 cm (approx. 24 inches) or more at

any point or with a surface area exceeding 10 square meters (approx. 12 feet in diameter), whether being constructed or purchased as an inflatable kit, must first receive a pool permit.



### > Heritage Subcommittee -Book Launch

Last year, the Town of Stratford marked the centenary of the end of the First World War in a special way - with a book honouring the lives of a number of our veterans from the Great War. "We will remember them": Stratford Heroes of the First World War is a project of the Stratford Heritage Committee, a group composed of Council members, staff and resident volunteers, with the book including contributions of information, photos, and stories from a number of Stratford families. Copies remain available for purchase at Stratford Town Centre during office hours and at The Bookmark in Charlottetown for \$19 plus tax.



### AWARD OBJECTIVES:

### GYMNASIUM HOURS OF OPERATION

Sunday to Thursday: 5:30am-9:45pm Friday and Saturday: 5:30am-8:45pm

The Stratford Town Centre is open for Stratford residents to use 7 days a week. The centre is equipped with a gymnasium, walking track, fitness centre, multipurpose meeting rooms, change rooms, stage and kitchen. Residents are welcome to use the fitness centre and walking track any time the building is open.

Residents are also welcome to use the gymnasium any time there are no programs or bookings scheduled. Schedules are posted weekly on the bulletin board, as well as being posted on our social media accounts daily.

To book any of the meeting rooms or gymnasium for private use, contact the recreation office at 902-569-2535. When you enjoy this beautiful facility please sign in and out at the front door. Indoor sneakers only in gym and track/fitness area.

### STRATFORD GYMNASIUM WALKING/ RUNNING TRACK DIRECTION AND RULES

The inside lane of the walking track is for walking and is the lane closest to the bleachers. Because we change directions each day, the direction to walk will be posted by the top of the stairs. The direction will always be opposite of the running lane. We ask that people do not walk more than two wide in the walking lane and that faster walkers pass in the outside lane when traffic allows.

The outside lane is for running and this is the lane closest to the fitness equipment area. Like the walking track, the direction is changed daily and is posted by the top of the stairs. We ask that people do not run in pairs, as the running lane is wide enough for one person only. The walking lane may be used for passing when traffic allows. Indoor sneakers must be worn (those never having been used outside) and please remember to sign in upon arrival.

Young children MUST be directly supervised by an adult if using the gymnasium track. Fitness area (equipment only) is restricted to 15 years and older.

#### > Under 4 Soccer

Our under 4 soccer is designed for fun and learning. Through game and play children will learn the basics of soccer. Registration is open to children born in 2015. Online registration is open or in person at Stratford Town Centre.

### TOBACCO - FREE POLICY FOR INDOOR AND OUTDOOR F ACILITIES


The Town of Stratford recognizes that exposure of non-smokers to tobacco smoke (passive smoking) is hazardous to their health and that non-smokers, including children, should be protected. Passive smoking can lead to serious illnesses in adults, such as bronchitis, lung cancer and cardiovascular disease. Children can also develop chest illnesses and asthma from exposure to tobacco smoke. Children who are in frequent contact with adults who smoke are also more likely to become smokers themselves.


The Town of Stratford has had a Tobacco-Free Policy since 2007 to protect the health of all concerned with an emphasis placed on children. In August 2018, Stratford Town Council approved and adopted a resolution to change the policy to a bylaw is now in effect. The bylaw will continue to be enforced through education however does allow for charges to be laid if necessary.

All properties & facilities owned by the Town are designated as tobacco-free. This includes all outdoor playing fields, trails, parks and playgrounds as well as Stratford Town Centre, Cotton Centre, and MacNeill Community Centre.

### GARDEN BEDS AND CATS GARDEN



Cats are in your garden because they like the soil. To discourage cats from using your garden bed as a litter box, you have to make your soil less appealing to them.

Here are a few things you can do to keep cats out of your soil:
Cats prefer to walk on soft soil and will avoid prickly surfaces. Make your garden beds into a less inviting litter box by adding something to your beds on which the refined paws of cats will fear to tread, such as sharp-edged pine cones or stone mulch.

Surround the garden area with a fence, such as chicken wire – something you can lean in the direction from which the cat will approach. Angling the placement will make it difficult for the cat to climb over.

Cats dislike the smell of lavender and lemon thyme, so plant a few of these throughout the garden space. As a bonus, inter-planting will attract pollinators and can help to avoid pests too.

Cats steer clear of strong citrus scents - throw peelings directly on your garden.

If your visitor has a favorite location, try washing the area well with a hose (or water from your rain barrel!) to remove the scent of urine spray. Cats tend to choose the same spot repeatedly — removing their previous stake on your garden will go a long way towards preventing reoccurrences.

Mix up a batch of cat-away spray. In a spray bottle, combine 1 tsp each of black pepper, dry mustard, cinnamon, a few drops of citrus essential oil, a crushed garlic clove and then fill it to the top with water. Apply to your garden beds.

Cats love honeysuckle & catnip, try planting these in an area away from your garden beds to lure the cats away.

- The playground structures are showing extensive wear and tear because of the high level of usage, which can be linked to our increasing community population.
- Playground creation and maintenance are not part of capital budgets; these playgrounds are funded exclusively through fundraising efforts of parents and through community support.




