MAYOR'S MESSAGE



Imagine That! Stratford continues to grow, attracting new residents and businesses that are contributing to a thriving and sustainable local economy. Volunteers and organizations are helping to improve our quality of life through community service, recreational events, and programs such as those offered at Stratford Community School. We truly live in a very special place, a community that we are proud to call home!

After a busy fall Town staff, Council and I are looking forward to making progress over the coming months on resident priorities including the following:

- The 2020/21 Town budget process is underway, with a public meeting scheduled for February 20, 2020. We will present a draft budget at this meeting for your feedback.
- A policing review will be considered as part of this year's budget process. If approved, current and future community policing needs, service standards and service delivery options will be examined.
- We are awaiting confirmation from the Province on land acquisition required for the new high school. We are also looking forward to hearing if our applications for Federal and Provincial funding have been approved for a multi-use facility which would be located near the new high school as part of the community campus. The facility would include an Olympic-sized rink for the 2023 Canada Winter Games. Fingers crossed!
- Staff, Council and I are also working hard to bring more affordable housing to Stratford through consultations with developers and the Provincial Government. We hope to be able to announce more affordable housing initiatives over the next year.
- Another important priority is working with the Stratford Area Watershed Improvement Group, developers and the Provincial Government on further measures to protect our environment.

Other projects underway include the Wastewater Delivery System project which is progressing well, with ongoing work happening under the bridge at this time. As for the new Stratford Emergency Services Centre, it is substantially complete with RCMP, the Fire Department and Island EMS moved, or soon to be moving, into their new accommodations.

In closing, on behalf of Town staff and Council, I wish all residents a Happy 2020! I hope you had an enjoyable and peaceful holiday season.

INFRASTRUCTURE DEPARTMENT

> Utility Projects

The Utility recently took over water and sewer infrastructure from the following developments: Southside Greens, Michael Thomas Way, Courtney Estates, Forest Trails Phase 3, APM apartments on Dale Drive, MacKinnon Drive extension, the Emergency Services Center, and both the Kinlock Crossing and Kinlock Plaza developments. When fully developed, these subdivisions will add close to 170 residential units and numerous commercial development units. In 2020, Utility will complete

upgrades to our Corish, Bayside and Pondside sewer lift stations and will also be installing lightning protection at all our water stations.

Utility staff continue to monitor and maintain our water and sewer system, comprising of 87 kilometers of sewer main, 1235 sewer manholes, 28 sewer lift stations, 4 water stations, a reservoir, 81 kilometers of water main, 614 water main valves along with 269 hydrants and valves, and last but not least, 3,431 residential and commercial water meters.

> Waste Water Delivery System

During the winter the contractor will continue with work under the bridge and at the new sewer lift station at our waste water treatment plant. In the spring, work will continue on the Charlottetown side to bring the pipe to the Charlottetown plant as shown in the photo below. The estimated timeline for the changeover to Charlottetown is fall 2020. Until then, staff will continue with maintenance programs to alleviate potential odors from the lagoons. Phase 2 of the project will begin with decommissioning the existing lagoons once the changeover to Charlottetown is



complete. This will involve draining the lagoons, removing the sludge, removing the existing geotube bags and reclaiming this area with reinstatement. The plan is to begin this work in late 2020 and complete it in 2021.

> Public Works

Maintenance

In the plans for this year is to have the Public Schools branch section of the roof re-shingled and some lighting at Town Center replaced with energy efficient LED lighting.

Fullerton's Creek Conservation Park

The washroom facility project at Fullerton's was recently tendered. If prices are within budget, construction will begin in the spring.

Emergency Services Center

The project took little less than a year to construct (substantially completed in December 2019). It is a beautiful building owned by the Town and occupied by the Crossroads Fire Department, RCMP and EMS. All three tenants are now (or soon to be) in the new Centre.

Roundabout

The roundabout project was administered and constructed by the Province of PEI as they own and maintain all streets in Stratford including the Trans Canada Highway. The major-

ity of work has been completed with final cleanup and deficiencies slated for 2020. Although the Town was not responsible for this project, it will help to improve traffic flow throughout Stratford and at the Mason Road intersection. We thank the Province for their work on this major project.

Sidewalks, Trails, Bike Lanes & Storm Water

Contractors have completed work on the sidewalk, curb, storm water, road and bike lane widening on the Georgetown Road from Woods Farm to the Tea Hill Subdivision. The Town hopes to extend the sidewalk further along the Georgetown Road in 2020 subject to funding.

Also in 2020, a paved walkway will allow users to go from Mason Road and across the roundabout to the Stratford and Georgetown Roads. The walkway will also be extended along the Trans Canada Highway from the roundabout to the Wheel Alignment Center. This welcomed addition to our active transportation system will improve walking and biking flow while improving the safety of all users. The MacKinnon Drive extension will also see a new multi-use path from the existing schools and along MacKinnon Drive connecting to Kinlock Road.

In 2019, the Town added almost 3 km of new trails to our existing system. These trails, across both Town and private land, are a combination of gravel, grassed and natural wooded. The Town will continue to extend our trail system (where possible) to connect existing subdivisions and walking/biking routes. We hope to have the continued support of private landowners to complete these additions and connections. Staff also began the installation of new signage. This sign work will continue in 2020 to improve user experience.

> Safety Services

The Town's Safety Services committee reviews lighting requests along with requests on speeding and traffic signs, crosswalks and other similar requests. These recommendations then have to be approved by the Province as they own the streets and roads in Stratford. The Town recently installed new lantern style streetlights in the Kinlock Creek subdivision to improve the safety of residents. Our six new speed radar signs have provided a lot of data that will be analyzed this winter to identify how much of an issue speeding is in the locations where they are located. Maritime Electric is continuing their program to replace high pressure sodium lights with LED lights as and when one goes out or needs repair.

> Reminder to Residents – Power Outage

In the event of a prolonged power outage Stratford Utility customers are asked to limit their water use in our community. Municipal water will remain available during a power outage however once it leaves your pipes and goes into our sewer system, the Town's pumping stations are not equipped with back up generators and must be serviced manually by our staff. This work continues throughout any power outage however, as you can imagine, it is slow and requires a continuous loop by staff to visit each of the pumping stations and empty them manually. The least amount of water we as residents put into the sewer system during a power outage, the easier it is on our system, and on our staff. We thank you for your cooperation and understanding.

SNOW CLEARING ON ROADS, SIDEWALKS &TRAILS

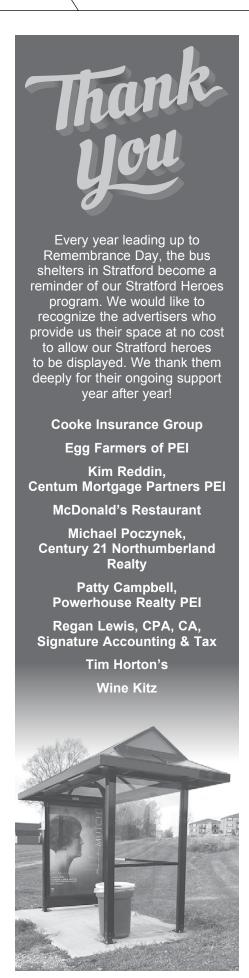
All roads and streets in the Town of Stratford are owned and cleared by the Province of PEI. If you have any issues with the clearing of snow off streets, please direct them to the Department of Transportation at (902) 368-4770. This includes issues with storm water drainage that may occur during heavy rain or melt events where ditches and storm water catch basins are overwhelmed or covered.

At this time trails in Stratford are not cleared of snow unless they are along the public right of way, lead to public services or are groomed for skiing by the Recreation department.

The Town would like to note that provincial and private contractors as well as Town staff make every effort to keep things tidy. However, some unavoidable messes cannot be helped as provincial snow plow operators and private contractors clear snow from parking lots and driveways at different times.

Be a good neighbour! The Town of Stratford asks residents to be mindful of one another. As storms and winter weather hit, please help out your neighbours who may not as easily be able to keep up with the snow clearing. In the event of power outages or prolonged storms it is also a great idea to check in on your neighbours, particularly those living alone, who are more senior or who have health conditions or aliments. They will appreciate it!

> Understanding your water meter bill

Why is my water meter reading used to also bill me for sewer when not all of the water I use ends up in the sewer system?



A number of Stratford Utility customers have asked this question since the water meter program began and water meters were installed. Customers ask this question because some of the Utility supplied water they use goes towards watering their gardens, washing cars, filling pools, building skating rinks, etc. and they know that this water is not entering into the Town's sewer system. This is true; however, customers also introduce a significant amount of liquids and solids into the sewer system that are in addition to the water supplied by the Utility. These come from food, bottled water, milk, pop, juice, coffee, tea, alcohol

etc.; and in some cases sump pumps, roof drains and foundation drains that are illegally connected into the sewer system. In fact, there is actually a significantly higher volume of sewage from customers than there is water being supplied to Utility customers.

In 2018, the Utility supplied customers with 774,309 m3 of potable water but treated 1,316,493 m3 of sewer. A portion of the extra sewage is from customers as indicated above and a portion of it is from infiltration of rainfall

into manholes and sewer pipes. The Utility is working to reduce the rainfall infiltration by installing trays in all of our manholes to prevent rainfall from entering the sewer system and by looking for leaks in the piping.

The installation of metering is designed to encourage conservation and to more fairly allocate the costs among customers. It is possible to also meter sewer but it is significantly more expensive than metering water, and doing so would mean a significant increase in rates for customers because the Utility operates on a cost recovery basis.

It is for all of these reasons that the standard utility practice is to use the water meter reading to charge for sewer usage as well. Conservation and the fair allocation of costs are important principles but so are economic efficiency and keeping rates reasonable for customers.

We are pleased to note that the amount of water supplied actually decreased by 2% in 2018, even though the number of customers continued to increase. It appears that the water metering program is having a positive conservation effect — well done Stratford!!

> Building Bylaw Review

UPDATE

With the release of the Building Codes Act and the pending adoption of the Building Codes Act Regulations by the Prince Edward Island government, the Town of Stratford has undertaken a review and revision of the Building Bylaw. The new Building Bylaw #50 will come into effect early in 2020 and will replace the old Building Bylaw #32.

In accordance with the Building Codes Act and Building Codes Act Regulations, the Town of Stratford is adopting the 2015 National Building Code and the 2015 National Energy Code of Canada for Buildings. The Building Bylaw has been reviewed in conjunction with the new Act and Regulations, and any changes required to the bylaw under the Act and Regulations have been made so that the new Building Bylaw #50 aligns with those requirements.

Some key changes included in the new Building Bylaw are:

- The adoption of the 2015 NBC and 2015 NECCB
- An increased scope for each of the required inspection points
- Provisions to issue partial occupancy permits
- Provisions to issue Orders Not To Cover and Orders Respecting Dangerous Property where a building poses a threat to public safety
- Increased penalties for offences under the Building Bylaw
- Provisions where a resident can appeal a decision of a building official

A Plain Language Guide is available on the Town website to help residents understand the changes to the Building Bylaw.

On Tuesday, September 23, a full ten days after their arrival, Erroll Boyd and Harry Connor were about to leave Canadian soil for Harbour Grace, Newfoundland - the next leg of the first Canadian transatlantic flight.

"We were loath to leave the beautiful girls of PEI behind, but will return there upon the completion of this flight," wrote Harry Connor in the flight log book. The make-shift airfield at Tea Hill was extended by 500 feet by the removal of a fence. Finally, a report of fine weather from St. John's was the deciding factor in permitting the departure.

Dr. and Mrs. Jenkins were the last to bid them God-speed. The Columbia hopped off from MacRae's field at 12:48 pm. "Taxiing over the undulating surface of the field the monoplane slipped gently into the air and began a slow climb.

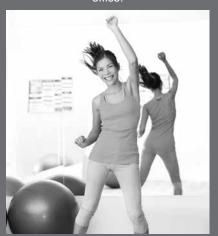

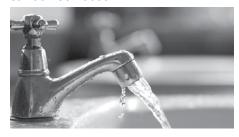
> Reduce your water consumption

RCMP IN STRATFORD



RCMP and Citizens on Patrol for a safer community... interested in volunteering?

The Stratford RCMP are encouraging residents to sign up with the volunteer program Citizens on Patrol (COP). RCMP officers have worked closely with this group over the years and continue to see the benefits of the partnership between police and residents towards making neighbourhoods safer. It's always good to know that there are people willing to step up and assist by reporting suspicious activities to police. Not only is it good for police to know, it's good for fellow neighbours to know. Simply having a constant presence is an excellent deterrent to criminals and the more positive presence we have, the more negative presence is out-numbered.

Often, residents are more aware of what might be unusual in their area and that insight is invaluable to RCMP. You know what is normal and not normal in your area so your input to the group and ultimately to police can help to keep crime from happening or solve crime when it does happen. Volunteers patrol by car, in pairs, for one or two

three-hour shifts a month, on Friday and Saturday nights and occasions like school events or planned parties, or statutory holidays such as Canada Day and Halloween which often sees more people out and about.

If you are interested in joining Citizens on Patrol or simply learn more about the program which is part of your community, you can contact Nicole Phillips at 902-388-1832 or email info@town-ofstratford.ca for further information. To be eligible to participate in the program, COPS volunteers must be at least 18 years of age, undergo a criminal record check, and complete an orientation of two evenings of supervised patrolling.

The RCMP are very appreciative of the great work done by this group since its inception in 2008 in contributing to the safety of their community by observing and reporting suspicious events to the RCMP, and in supporting Town initiatives.

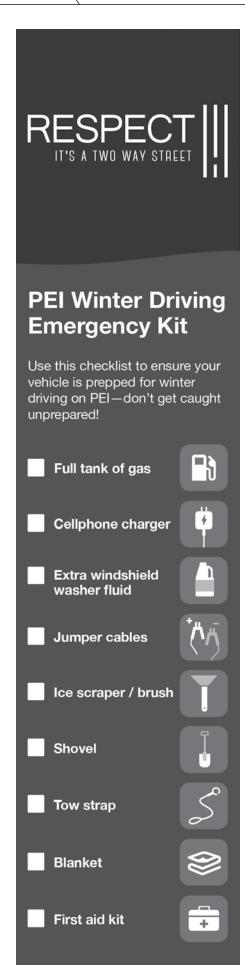
CITIZENS ON PATROL NOW RECRUITING VOLUNTEERS

Now that the holidays have passed, students are settling back into their school routine and the winter weather has set in, it is an excellent opportunity to reflect on the months past.

Before the holiday season began, we completed the fall sitting of the Legislative Assembly. We accomplished many things during this session: we passed Bill 24 which banned conversion therapy on the Island, we unanimously voted to increase the minimum age of vaping and smoking to 21, ensured that the rights, interests, and viewpoints of children and youth will be protected through an *independent* child and youth advocate, in addition to addressing many other issues Islanders face.

This past fall, the expansion of Stratford Elementary was officially opened; this has allowed the school to accommodate our students better and improve the quality of their education. This was the first step in ensuring our children and youth are getting access to quality educational facilities. In partnership with the Town of Stratford, the provincial government will begin planning and constructing the new Stratford High School, which will be part of a community campus that include Town recreational facilities. This will benefit not only our students but our community as a whole.



I am actively engaging all levels of government to study and develop the necessary traffic flow plan that will enhance the traffic entering and leaving our community via the Hillsborough Bridge. This work is necessary in order to move forward with an active transportation corridor across the bridge and between the Town of Stratford and the City of Charlottetown, while also increasing the efficiency of traffic flow.



Our Town of Stratford & Area annual food drive this fall was an absolute success; with 22 pallets of food donated, and over \$1,600 in donations received, we have made a significant impact on our community. Thank you, everyone, for your tremendous support.
