

MAYOR'S MESSAGE



Happy New Year everyone!

I would like to thank all residents and businesses for continuing to follow the direction of our public health officials to minimize the effects of the pandemic in Stratford while keeping the economy going as much as possible. There is now light at the end of the tunnel with the anticipated roll-out of vaccination programs to beat this virus once and for all.

Despite everything that has happened in 2020, a lot of positive steps have been taken in Stratford over the past year. The project to pipe our wastewater to Charlottetown is nearing completion, freeing up our beautiful waterfront. The new Emergency Services Centre is now fully operational. The Town has purchased 170 acres of land to accommodate a new high school, a future junior high and whatever other community facilities may be determined to be necessary in the future. The active transportation lane on the Hillsborough Bridge is underway. The new MacKinnon/Glen Stewart/Marion Drive connection makes access to our elementary and primary schools much safer and easier. Also, we are all happy to see the return of a hardware store to our town, with the opening the new Kinlock Home Hardware.

As part of our budget planning process, I thank residents who are participating in public consultations by identifying their spending priorities. Long term budget planning will consider the initiatives that are most important to our taxpayers and help identify where our spending priorities should lie. We will soon present a draft 2021/2022 budget for residents' comments, with the final version being presented for Council approval before March 31, 2021.

Phase 1 of the public consultation on developing the waterfront is also now complete, with phase 2 coming soon, and a completion date targeted for the end of March 2021.

Lastly, I would like to reiterate how important our annual resident survey is in all decisions made by Council. It helps staff immeasurably in designing and delivering programs and services for residents. I encourage you to participate in the survey to help guide future decisions which will affect you and your family.



In the event of a prolonged power outage, Stratford Utility customers are asked to limit their water use. Municipal water will remain available during a power outage; however, once it goes into the sewer system, the Town's pumping stations are not equipped with backup generators and must be serviced manually by staff. This is usually a slow process and requires a continuous loop by staff to visit each pumping station and empty them manually. Therefore, the least amount of water that goes into the sewer system during a power outage is easier on our system and staff.

> Utility Projects

Infrastructure staff are busy closing out 2020 projects while preparing for 2021. With COVID-19, projects were a little later starting and continue to cause issues with completion timelines. Ongoing projects from 2020 include upgrades to our Corish, Bayside and Pondside sewer lift stations and up-grades at our three water stations.

Several new apartment buildings have just come online and that will increase the number of water and sewer customers on the Utility services. Utility staff will continue to monitor and maintain our water and sewer system, now comprising of 87 kilometers of sewer main, 1244 sewer manholes, 28 sewer lift stations, 4 water stations and a reservoir, 82 kilometers of water main, 618 water main valves, 272 hydrants and valves, and last but not least, 3440 residential and commercial water meters.



As development continues in 2021, several subdivision extensions and new subdivisions are in the concept and/or design phase. Infrastructure staff are now busy preparing equipment for the summer and completing repairs and maintenance as needed inside our buildings.

> Wastewater Treatment Delivery System

Phase 1 of this project began in September of 2019. It has been the Town of Stratford's largest sewer project to date and is substantially complete at this time. The reinstatement and decommissioning of the Town lagoons will begin this spring.

> Inflow & Infiltration

With the wastewater now being pumped to Charlottetown for treatment, we cannot stress enough that residents are not to connect their sump pumps into the Town's sewer system as stated in the Water and Sewer Customer Service Regulations Bylaw. Since utility rates are based on flows, discharging storm water, ground water, water used for heating and cooling etc. into the sanitary sewer system will ultimately increase flows and raise utility rates for all customers. The Town continues to implement the Inflow and Infiltration program to identify and eliminate excess stormwater into our sewer system.

> Public Works

At Stratford Town Centre, the Public Schools Branch portion was re-shingled this year. More lighting throughout Town Center was replaced with energy efficient led lighting, upgrades were completed on the Town Centre's heating and cooling systems and while the building was temporarily closed to the public during COVID-19, staff completed painting and repairs to the gymnasium and change room areas.

The Gertrude Cotton Arts Center has had new flooring installed while a window and hot water heater were replaced at the Youth/Seniors building. In Tea Hill Park, staff replaced the UV light on the well and completed sanding and painting of the cement flooring. Lastly, the Fullerton's Creek Conservation Park washroom facility project was completed in the late fall of 2020.

Sidewalks Trails Bike Lane& Storm Water

In the fall of 2020, contractors completed the sidewalk extension on the Georgetown Road from Edgehill Terrace to 296 Georgetown Road. The Town hopes to extend the sidewalk further along Georgetown Road to the Town boundary in 2021.

In 2020, new Active Transportation paths were completed by the Province from the Sobeys intersection to the roundabout and along MacKinnon Drive from Kinlock Road to the schools. The Province of PEI is also busy installing a new path across the Hillsborough Bridge.



We understand residents have been enjoying the trails, parks, and many sections of the Town's Active Transportation system during these COVID-19 times. We hope that users continue to stay active and get outdoors on our growing active transportation network and we would like to thank the Province of PEI for their continued support of Stratford's Active Transportation routes.

> Safety Services

The Town's Safety Services committee reviews lighting requests along with requests for speed and traffic signs, crosswalks, and other similar instruments. These recommendations then need to be approved by the Province as they own the streets in Stratford.

Our speed radar signs continue to provide valuable data to RCMP and the Town. We have recently purchased another stationary sign and a new portable speed sign that will also collect data.

New crosswalks were installed on the Kinlock Road, at the Hollis Avenue & Mason Road intersection and by the Town Centre entrance on Shakespeare Drive.



Maritime Electric continues their program to replace high pressure sodium lights with LED. As part of their daily work, they also replace existing LED lights as repairs are required or add new lights as requested by the Town.

DID YOU?

All streets in the Town of Stratford are owned, maintained, and operated by the Province of PEI. If you have repairs to streets or signage to report in our community, you can text the info to 902-200-6649.

SNOW CLEARING OF ROADS/ SIDEWALKS & TRAILS

All roads and streets in the Town of Stratford are owned and cleared by the Province of P.E.I. If you have any issues with the clearing of snow off streets, please direct them to Department of Transportation at 902-368-4770 or 902-368-4750. This includes issues with storm water drainage that occur during heavy rain or melt events where ditches and storm water catch basins are overwhelmed or covered.

At this time trails in Stratford are not cleared of snow unless they are along the public right of way, lead to public services or are groomed for winter activities by the Recreation Department.

As for snow clearing of driveways, parking lots, streets and sidewalks, the Town would like to note that contractors in Stratford, like every community on the Island, make every effort to keep things tidy but there may be times when their work overlaps and messes occur. Please be patient and reach out to these contractors if you observe issues that require their attention.

> Official Plan Review Update

UPDATE

The Official Plan update is progressing along, and suggested changes are being made to more accurately reflect the Town of Stratford in 2021. The Plan is a living document intended to be consistently improved upon. The next step is to bring the proposed

changes to Planning Board and Council in the new year. An open house will be held, in some format, to hear feedback, and the public will be able to comment on the draft document.

> Development Permits

From January to November 2020, the Planning Department has issued a total of 213 development permits. The following table shows a summary of development activities between January and November 2020.

> Stratford Recognizes Role of Tea Hill Park in First Canadian Transatlantic Flight

An interpretive panel was unveiled this fall at Tea Hill Park that tells the story of the location's direct connection to a milestone in Canadian aviation history. The land, which today is home to one of the Town of Stratford's community parks, was 90 years ago the departure point for the first Canadian transatlantic flight.

The Bellanca monoplane took off from Tea Hill Park after an unexpected landing on September 23, 1930 and successfully continued onto Harbour Grace, Newfoundland and further on to England, despite the many challenges and delays.

> Stratford Honour Roll Project



This project is still ongoing and will make the existing cenotaph fully accessible year-round so it can be used as an engagement piece for Veterans, Armed Forces members, and residents. It will also serve as a community learning piece for our youth and is intended to be a place that people can gather throughout the year for remembrance and reflection.

> Community Campus



The Town of Stratford has officially signed purchase and sale agreements with two property owners to purchase approximately 170 acres of land for the planned Stratford Community Campus. The property is located between the Stratford Business Park and the Bunbury Road.

The Stratford Community Campus will be developed over a period of years and will include the new high school, along with possible sport fields, multiuse courts, trails and community wellness centre, among other items. There is also sufficient land for a junior high school in the future. The total cost of the land was approximately \$2.4 million. A portion will be sold to the province for the high school and a portion will be sold to the Stratford Business Park Corporation for an extension of the business park.

We thank the property owners for agreeing to sell this land to the Town for the Community Campus, which will serve the educational, recreational, and cultural needs of residents for many years to come.

STRATFORD YOUTH CENTRE

The Stratford Youth Centre offers youth in Grades 5-12, a safe and supportive environment to participate at the social and recreational centre, in various clubs, and at special events. In turn, this encourages social growth and helps develop self-confidence and skills to prepare youth for their future. The Centre guides members to focus on volunteering, empowerment, community engagement and provides youth with an opportunity to voice their concerns about the community and show that they can really make a difference.



Membership allows access to the Youth Centre, numerous clubs and events, as well as an opportunity to participate in regular weekly member meetings. There is no cost for youth to join the Stratford Youth Centre however all members must help out with regular fundraising and volunteer opportunities within the community to maintain their membership. Parents are strongly encouraged to become involved with the Youth Centre and help with our different events as well.



Youth members are asked to commit to a minimum of 20 volunteer hours with the Stratford Youth Centre every year to maintain their membership. This may include working at an event, assisting nonprofit organizations, and fundraising. All volunteer hours that

are collected by members are recorded and can be used on a resume as a valuable life experience as they approach adulthood. Upcoming volunteer opportunities will be included in parent emails and weekly member meetings. Stratford Youth Centre members are also eligible to earn special prizes and awards for their volunteer service with the Stratford Youth Centre.



Snowshoes are available to borrow from gym attendants during Town Centre operational hours. You can borrow them from the Town for your next outdoor expedition and we have them in various sizes (for children and adults). Sign them out at NO COST!



> Fitness with Benches

This winter, the 9 benches installed by the Town over the summer are sure to help you stay fit and active. Combined these benches can assist you to complete 18 full body exercises, with each bench having 2 workout signs mounted next to it. The workouts are simple to follow with stick figures demonstrating the positioning.



These 9 benches run along Shakespeare Drive (5 total), one at Stratford Town Centre, two located at the 'Y' in the trail just off of Shakespeare and Heron Drive, with the last one on the trail connecting to Glen Stewart Drive (near Reactive Wellness).

> Town Centre Gymnasium Hours of operation

The Stratford Town Centre is open for Stratford residents to use 7 days a week. The centre is equipped with a gymnasium, walking track, fitness centre, multipurpose meeting rooms, change rooms, stage and kitchen. Residents are welcome to use the fitness centre and walking track any time the building is open.

Residents are also welcome to use the gymnasium any time there are no programs or bookings scheduled. Schedules are posted weekly on the bulletin board, as well as being posted on our social media accounts daily.

To book any of the meeting rooms or gymnasium for private use, contact the recreation office at 902-569-2535. When you enjoy this beautiful facility please sign in and out at the front door. Indoor sneakers only in gym and track/fitness area.

Young children MUST be directly supervised by an adult if using the gymnasium track. Fitness area (equipment only) is restricted to 15 years and older.

Stratford Gymnasium Walking Track Direction and Rules



Both lanes of the track are for walking only. Each day the direction to walk is posted by the top of the stairs as we change it each day.

We ask that people do not walk more than two feet wide so that faster walkers may pass in the outside lane when traffic allows.

> Dog Walking & Littering

Did you know that although disposable doggie waste bags are being advertised as biodegradable they take years to decompose (if at all) and actually belong in our waste system on PEI?

The Town of Stratford has been receiving an increase in the number of calls from residents expressing disappointment and frustration with seeing disposable doggie waste bags being littered around our community. They are being left on or near the

edge of sidewalks, trails and even sometimes on residents private properties. Any person caught can be subject to fines under the provincial litter laws. Please respect our community and your neighbours by disposing of all litter properly.

PERMISSION TO USE TOWN FACILITIES

The Town of Stratford owns and operates a number of parks, playgrounds, playing fields and facilities. Groups and individuals who want to use Town facilities for any reason must fill out an application and obtain permission from the recreation department.

Town parks include all neighborhood parks and playgrounds, as well as our major parks; Tea Hill Park, Pondside Park, Kinlock Park, Robert L. Cotton Memorial Park, and Fullerton's Creek Conservation Park. Town facilities include the Stratford Town Centre, MacNeill Community Centre, Bunbury Rink Building and Cotton Park buildings.

Town facilities are available to groups or individuals on a priority basis.

AWARD OBJECTIVES

Volunteers are - and always will be - an essential part of our community.

This award is an annual award, which acknowledges and rewards a volunteer citizen who has made an outstanding contribution to our community.

The recipient will receive prizes (to be determined by Town Council) and the recipient will have his or her picture displayed at Stratford Town Center. The winner's name will also be engraved on a special trophy to honor each year's Volunteer of the Year. ALL NOMINEES will be recognized for their volunteer efforts and will receive an official acknowledgement on behalf of the Town of Stratford.

ELIGIBILITY

Volunteering is the act of people being involved in the improvement of their surroundings. Volunteer acts can occur within a structured organization (ex. volunteering at your library) or in an informal setting (ex. raking leaves for your elderly neighbor).

Those eligible to receive this award include any individual who performs volunteer act/acts (as defined above) within the Town of Stratford community. The purpose of this award is to focus on recognizing individual citizens; however the judging committee will also accept a submission that nominates two or more people together.

SELECTION PROCESS

The Town of Stratford will oversee the award, provide title, and the way in which it is presented. A committee under the direction of the Town's Recreation Committee will select the winner.

Completed nomination forms may be forwarded to the Town of Stratford's Recreation, Culture & Events Department at the address below.

All submission must be signed. The annual deadline for submissions is June 5. The award will be presented annually at Town of Stratford's Canada Day celebrations.

Award decisions will be selected based solely on the information provided, so it is important that all relevant information accompanies the nomination in order for the judging committee to make the best possible decision.

Reduce your water consumption with a FREE Water Audit!

The average person on PEI uses 220 litres of water per day – that is a lot of water! Have you thought about how much you use, and how you might use less?

As a Stratford resident who pays a quarterly water bill, you are eligible for a free, in-home water audit that will tell you everything you need to know about your current water use (things like, how much water your faucets and toilets use) and how to reduce your consumption. The audit will also let you know if you have any water leaks, which are often not visible and can go undetected.

RCMP IN STRATFORD

RCMP offer Eagle Feathers at local detachments as part of Indigenous Justice Program



On November 2nd, a ceremony was held at Fanningbank, the Lieutenant Governor's official residence, to launch the PEI Eagle Feather as an important element of the RCMP/MCPEI Indigenous Justice Program initiative.

The Eagle Feather is used as an option to swear legal oaths and provides an opportunity for the Eagle Feather to be used in the same way as a Bible or affirmation and may also be offered as comfort to a client when interacting with employees at a detachment. All clients including victims, witnesses and police officers will have the option to swear legal oaths on an Eagle Feather at all detachments, including the Stratford RCMP office.

In the morning of November 2nd, Keptin Bernard cleansed the Eagle Feathers through a smudging ceremony prior to the afternoon event where Chief Bernard provided an explanation of the significance of the Eagle Feather, and Chief Gould offered a prayer. Both chiefs presented Chief Superintendent Ebert and each of the commanders and supervisors with the Eagle Feathers to take back to their respective detachments. The Eagle Feather honours Indigenous culture and accepts the customs and traditions as one part of the ongoing collaboration in reconciliation efforts.

Eagle Feather background:

- When a client enters a detachment to provide a statement, they will be given three options; to swear on a Bible, affirm or affirm with an Eagle Feather.
- The Eagle Feather may also be offered as comfort to a client when interacting with employees at the detachment.
- The Eagle Feather can be used by all citizens. Should the client wish to use the Eagle Feather, it would be held by the client while providing their evidence or statement.

Anyone interested in using an Eagle Feather at a detachment can simply ask upon arrival and it will be provided.






Citizens on Patrol-Stratford (COPS) is a volunteer program designed to encourage residents of Stratford to contribute to the safety of their community. Volunteers are proud to support the excellent work of RCMP members in Stratford, by serving as an "extra set of eyes and ears" and reporting any observed suspicious activity. Committed to crime prevention, COPS volunteers patrol by car, in pairs, in residential and business areas for one or two three-hour shifts a month on Friday and Saturday nights. COPS will also patrol on occasions such as prom nights and Halloween, and support Town of Stratford events and safety initiatives. To be eligible to participate in the program, COPS volunteers must be at least eighteen years of age, undergo a criminal record check, and complete an orientation of two evenings of supervised patrolling. 

DID YOU KNOW?

An application and agreement with the Town is required if you're looking to operate a business from your home, including a building permit IF any alterations/renovations are being made to accommodate the business.

Some conditions to keep in mind if you're looking to set up your home-based business:

- (1) The home occupation will be restricted to the portion of the dwelling or accessory building devoted to the business.
 - (2) No storage on the lot will be allowed.
- (3) The floor area devoted to the home occupation cannot be more than 25% of the combined floor area of all buildings on the lot, or 50 square metres (538 square feet).
 - (4) It must not create a nuisance to residents in the surrounding neighbourhood.
 - (5) The driveway must be separate and independent from the residential driveway of the dwelling.


