MAYOR'S MESSAGE



Spring has sprung and long, sunny days are on their way! The vaccine roll-out now underway allows us to begin to breathe a sigh of relief while we continue to respect public health guidelines that will help us reach the pandemic finish line.

In Stratford, progress is being made on many important projects:

- The Town's wastewater is now flowing to the Charlottetown Pollution Control Plant, the lagoons are being decommissioned, and the land is being reclaimed for a new Town entrance and waterfront development. Residents have provided a lot of great ideas for creating a beautiful and functional park area along and near the waterfront.
- We will all be pleased to see the Provincial Government's construction completed on the Hillsborough Bridge with the opening of an Active Transportation lane to allow safe passage for walkers and cyclists.
- Construction of a new Stratford High School by the Provincial Government is much closer, with the Town's purchase of required land and a slight change in Stratford's boundary having received IRAC approval. Some necessary rezoning of the property and adjacent land will be required which is hoped will all be finalized by early summer.
- A consulting firm has been contracted to develop a Master Plan for the entire Community Campus property. This plan will recommend the best location for all buildings, facilities, sports fields, and other elements to maximize functionality for educational and community use.
- Now that over 1,000 residents have identified their priorities for long-term budget projects, Town Staff and Council will develop a plan for the next five to ten years, with supporting financial forecasts, clearly identifying how your tax dollars will be spent to put in place the recreational, transit and safety infrastructure, programs, and services that you want and need. More will be shared with residents when complete.

I would like to sincerely thank all residents who participated in consultations regarding the long-term budget priorities and input to the development of the plan for our new waterfront park. The direction you provide each year by completing the annual resident survey is also a key consideration in Council decision-making. The engagement of Stratford residents is essential to making our vibrant, growing Town so much better. Wishing everyone a happy, safe, and fun summer!

> Utility Projects

Subdivisions

Developers in Stratford are required to install sewer and water systems during development. After testing and approval is complete, Stratford Utility takes over the systems. This year it is expected to take over water and sewer infrastructure in three new subdivisions and 140 serviced units. The numerous developments being proposed will also influence how many water and sewer customers will be taken onboard by the Town at year end.

Sewer Lift Station Upgrades

Stratford Utility has been reviewing our sewer systems over the past year to identify areas that will require upgrades to remain capable of receiving new development and deter storm water infiltration. A preliminary report has been received from our consultant that list several options. Utility staff will review these recommendations and proceed from there.

Below is an image of our new sewer lift station at the Wastewater Treatment Plant.



Water Station Upgrades

Contractors are presently upgrading our well pumps and piping at the Pondside water station. This station was built in the year 2000 and was due for some upgrades.

Fullerton's Park Washroom Facility

This project was completed in early spring and washrooms are now open to the public daily. The facility is located just behind our water station along the trail.



Wastewater Treatment Delivery System

Stratford's wastewater is now being pumped to Charlottetown and work is continuing on the decommissioning of the lagoons followed by the return of the area to parkland. Some odour may be released periodically while this work takes place.

Storm Water Infiltration

This is an ongoing maintenance project to reduce the groundwater infiltration into the Town's sewer system. Any water that infiltrates our sewer system will eventually go to Charlottetown's plant. Since utility rates are based on flows, discharging storm water, ground water, water used for heating and cooling, etc. into the sanitary system will ultimately increase flows and raise utility rates for all customers. Over the last several years staff have been repairing manholes, adjusting their heights, and adding silt catch trays under the covers to prevent such infiltrations.

Please note that it is illegal to discharge any storm water, surface water, water from sump pumps, roof run-off, surface drainage, subsurface drainage, foundation drainage or water used for heating or cooling into our sewer system.

> Public Works Department

Maintenance

Staff are busy with grass cutting, property and building maintenance, installing and relocating temporary speed humps, maintaining trails, and other daily duties. Pending funding, energy retrofits will take place at Robert Cotton Center and solar panels will be installed at the Stratford Emergency Service Center.

Also taking place this year, Pondside Park parking lot will be paved and additional electric car charging stations installed with three located at Stratford Town Hall and one at Stratford Emergency Services Center. A dry storage shed will be constructed at our Town maintenance facility as well



Active Transportation

The Province of PEI is busy completing the active transportation corridor across the Hillsborough Bridge to the Hopeton and Stratford Road intersection. The Town has advocated on behalf of residents for this project for many years and we are all excited to see the completion in the near future.

The Town recently tendered work for the AT path on Keppoch Road, from the intersection of Kinlock Road to the Town boundary past Tea Hill Park. The final scope of work will depend on project tender costs with the completion of this work connecting our AT network around Stratford.

In the last couple of years, the Town has added several private natural trails to our system. We continue to work with landowners to share their natural trails with the residents of Stratford. We appreciate these landowners working with the Town to enhance our active transportation system.

Speed Signs/Speed Humps

In our ongoing effort to reduce speeding in Stratford, the Town continues to purchase speed radar signs and speed humps. These radar signs provide data to our Safety Services committee to determine if there is speeding and to what extent, whether it is becoming a community occurrence or refined to a few drivers. Staff continue to install our temporary speed humps throughout Stratford. These humps, as indicated, are temporary and are moved around during the summer to deter speeding in targeted neighbourhoods.



Town Roads Streets and Ditch Infilling

All roads, streets and ditches in Stratford are owned by the Province of PEI. Provincial crews are already cleaning up from winter plow, salt, and storm water damage. They are also busy patching potholes and installing or replacing culverts. Please note that any request to infill your ditch or replace a culvert should be directed to the Provincial Department of Highways.

A few basic tips to get you started:

Where possible, always ride on the right side of the roadway as close to the right curb or the edge of the road as possible.

Be sure to always ride in a single file except when overtaking and passing another bike.

Yield the right-of-way to pedestrians.

Use a bike bell on your bike to warn other users of the road that you are approaching.

> The Building Bylaw and National Building Code

In 2020, the Town of Stratford adopted a new Building Bylaw (Bylaw #50), which included the adoption of the 2015 National Building Code and the 2017 National Energy Code of Canada for Buildings. The Building Bylaw is enforced through scheduled inspections during construction at various stages of completion. These inspections will verify work against the approved submitted plans and against the NBCC.



What to submit in a new application for a single detached development?

- Development Application Form
- Utility Application Form
- Entrance Way Application Form
- Completed Deck Pamphlet
- Building Plans; including, floor plans, elevations, and cross-section
- Truss Package; including, layouts and individual truss design
- Site Plan/Grading Plan (see below)
- Letter of Authorization (see below)
- Additional information may be required

Preliminary plans will no longer be accepted.

> Site Plan/Grading Plan

The Planning Department requires a grading plan to be submitted for new development. This plan should be prepared by a surveyor, professional engineer, or any other qualified person. It should indicate the existing grade of the property, the elevation of the tops of foundations of adjacent structures, the ditch, the street, and the proposed top of elevation of the

proposed development as well as the proposed flow of run-off once construction is complete.

> Letter of Authorization

If the person making an application for development is not the property owner, they must submit a Letter of Authorization in which the property owner identifies an authorized agent who will represent them on their behalf.

To ensure that your permit is ready in time for your project start date, please submit your complete application as early as possible.

> Deck Permit Requirements

Residents need to apply for a deck permit before starting a deck project. Applications are processed once all required documentation is submitted and the deposit is paid.

Required documentation list:

- Development Application Form
- Letter of Authorization (if applicant is not the landowner)
- Site Plan, drawn to scale indicating:
- Lot dimensions:
- Dimensions of all existing and proposed buildings and structures on the lot;
- Setbacks of all existing and proposed buildings and structures.
- Completed Deck Pamphlet
- Building Plans, drawn to scale and indicating:
 - Dimensions of structures;
 - Spacing and size of all structural members (joists, beams, posts, footings, etc.)

Application fee: \$100




PLANNING, DEVELOPMENT AND HERITAGE

Decks will be inspected by the Building Official twice during construction at the following inspection points: (1) Inspection of deck columns prior to backfilling and (2) Final inspection after completion of all work. A deck should not be occupied until an occupancy permit has been obtained. The development permit will be issued as soon as it is determined that the work meets the requirements of the Town's bylaws and when applicable fees are fully paid. Deck permits are valid for a 12-month period and are normally issued within five (5) to seven (7) business days.

> Pool Permits

Swimming pools require a development permit to ensure safety measures are being applied. Any pool having a depth of 60 cm (approx. 24 inches) or more at any point or with a surface area exceeding 10 square meters (approx. 12 feet in diameter),

whether being constructed or purchased as an inflatable kit, must first receive a pool permit.



Official Plan Review Update

The Official Plan update is continuing. Changes have been made to reflect recommendations from our consultation with relevant stakeholders. Some final updates will be inserted following completion of the Charlottetown Region Growth Study. Next, the draft document will be presented to Planning Board and Council with a recommendation to proceed to a Public Open House to solicit feedback.

HERITAGE AWARD

The Brown & Hood Heritage Award is presented annually to an individual, group, organization, or company who strives to preserve Stratford's heritage. Mayor Ogden was pleased to present the 2020 Town of Stratford Brown & Hood Heritage Award recently to Moe Rodgerson for his work on the heritage property of Mill Brook Farm. The property has been in Moe's family since 1886 when his maternal great grandfather, Edward Kelly, purchased it from Edward Picton, the son of Major John Picton Beete who had passed it on to his son upon his return to England. The house features an Island stone foundation, and many of the original design features such as large central dormer with eve returns, six-over-six windows, central entrance door with transom and sidelights, decorative verandah and interior woodwork remain. The property was registered in 2008 as a Provincial Heritage Place.

AWARD OBJECTIVES

Volunteers are - and always will be - an essential part of our community. This award is an annual award, which acknowledges and rewards a volunteer citizen who has made an outstanding contribution to our community.

The recipient will receive prizes (to be determined by Town Council) and the recipient will have his or her picture displayed at Stratford Town Center.

The winner's name will also be engraved on a special trophy to honor each year's Volunteer of the Year. ALL NOMINEES will be recognized for their volunteer efforts and will receive an official acknowledgement on behalf of the Town of Stratford.

ELIGIBILITY

Volunteering is the act of people being involved in the improvement of their surroundings. Volunteer acts can occur within a structured organization (ex. volunteering at your library) or in an informal setting (ex. raking leaves for your elderly neighbor).

Those eligible to receive this award include any individual who performs volunteer act/ acts (as defined above) within the Town of Stratford community. The purpose of this award is to focus on recognizing individual citizens; however the judging committee will also accept a submission that nominates two or more people together.

SELECTION PROCESS

The Town of Stratford will oversee the award, provide title, and the way in which it is presented. A committee under the direction of the Town's Recreation Committee will select the winner.

TOWN EVENTS & INITIATIVES

CLIMATE SENSE PROJECT

In 2021, the Town welcomed an intern from the ClimateSense Program to work on a climate change adaptation project. The project takes a holistic look at coastal infrastructure vulnerabilities, with a specific aim of developing and implementing adaptation measures for wastewater pumping stations as well as coastal properties. This project will ultimately provide the Town with the capacity to implement concrete adaptation measures to coastal effects of climate change.



RESIDENTIAL TREE PLANTING PROGRAM

Stratford's new Residential Tree Planting Program was launched this year in January, offering trees to 100 eligible residents. The program enables residents to access low cost, good-quality, native trees, and assistance to plant them. The main goal of the program is to increase Stratford's urban canopy, particularly in neighbourhoods where trees are lacking. These 9 benches run along Shakespeare Drive (5 total), one at Stratford Town Centre, two located at the 'Y' in the trail just off Shakespeare and Heron Drive, with the last one on the trail connecting to Glen Stewart Drive (near Reactive Wellness).

> Permission to use Town **Facilities**

The Town of Stratford owns and operates a number of parks, playgrounds, playing fields and facilities. Groups and individuals who want to use Town facilities for any reason must fill out an application and obtain permission from the recreation department. Town parks include all neighborhood parks and playgrounds, as well as our major parks; Tea Hill Park, Pondside Park, Kinlock Park, Robert L. Cotton Memorial Park, and Fullerton's Creek Conservation Park. Town facilities include the Stratford Town Centre, MacNeill Community Centre, Bunbury Rink Building and Cotton Park buildings. Town facilities are available to groups or individuals on a priority basis.

Stratford Gymnasium Walking Track Direction and Rules

Both lanes of the track are for walking only. Each day the direction to walk is posted by the top of the stairs as we change it each day. We ask that people do not walk more than two feet wide so that faster walkers may pass in the outside lane when traffic allows.

Young children MUST be directly supervised by an adult when using the track.

Fitness area (equipment only) is restricted to 15 years and older.


> Town Centre Gymnasium Hours of operation

The Stratford Town Centre is open for Stratford residents to use 7 days a week. The centre is equipped with a gymnasium, walking track, fitness centre, multipurpose meeting rooms, change rooms, stage and kitchen. Residents are welcome to use the fitness centre and walking track any time the building is open.

Residents are also welcome to use the gymnasium during scheduled open gym times. Schedules are posted online at www.townofstratford.ca and daily in the morning on Facebook and Twitter. Indoor footwear is required at all times in the gym and in the track/ fitness area.

To book any of the meeting rooms or gymnasium for private use, contact the recreation office at 902-569-6250. When you enjoy this beautiful facility, remember to sign in and out with the gym attendants by providing your name, phone # and community. Masks are required entering and exiting the facility, or at any time when social distancing cannot be maintained but can be removed while exercising. This policy will continue while public health measures remain in place on PEI.

ACTIVE TRANSPORTATION

Summer is finally here and with many sunny days ahead, this is the time to step out and explore the outdoors!

Stratford has nearly **30 km of trail** throughout the Town to complement our 20 km of sidewalk and 40 km of roadside bike lanes. These trails are a mix of natural, paved, or gravel over Town, public and private lands and ideal for walking, jogging, biking, and hiking.

Please note: NO UNAUTHORIZED MOTOR VEHICLES ARE PERMITTED ON ANY TRAILS IN STRATFORD.

Here is a list of some of our longer trail systems

(maps for each trail are accessible on our website):

TRANS CANADA TRAIL

Runs through Stratford from the Hillsborough Bridge to the Mt Herbert Rd Trail Start Distance 7 km

Parking is available at several points along the trail

This is a paved and gravel trail for walkers, joggers, and bikers.

The section from Fullerton's Marsh to the Mt Herbert Rd is owned and operated by the Province of PEI.

TUCKERS WAY HIKING TRAIL

Located off Tuckers Way or the Keppock Rd Distance .5 km

This is a natural hiking and mountain biking trail. Although it is only short in distance it has a steep terrain through a wooded and storm water drainage area. It connects to other trails and to the sidewalk and bike lane system on Keppoch Rd.

FULLERTON'S CREEK CONSERVATION PARK TRAIL SYSTEM

A gravel trail system within Fullerton's Creek Conservation Park with numerous loops around scenic open fields and through woods. Trails access the Fullerton's' Marsh lookout. The TCT is part of this system and continues through to Mt Herbert.

5 KINLOCK CREEK & AREA TRAIL SYSTEM

Located Off the Kinlock Rd
Distance 5 km

This area is one of our best kept secrets. The trails are located over Town and private lands, so we ask users to respect the trail system. These trails are a combination of gravel and natural paths with multiple terrain changes. It is used by walkers, joggers, mountain bikers, hikers, snowshoers, and skiers. It is an interlocking system of trails joining the surrounding subdivisions. The trails can take you along a salt marsh, through multiple woods, along a stream and through open fields. The trails can be accessed from Harvest Dr, NottingHill Dr Park, Clearview Dr or Strawberry Hill and are often used for either short or long outings.

COTTON PARK TRAIL SYSTEM

Located at 57 Bunbury Rd (Behind the Youth/Seniors facility)

Distance 1 km

Parking Available

A gravel trail system within Cotton Park with numerous loops through the open park along hedge lines and through the woods.

4 CLEARVIEW ESTATES TRAIL SYSTEM

Located on Brookside Drive in Clearview Estates (Just off the Trans Canada Highway)

Distance 1 km

A natural trail system that meanders through wooded and grassed areas along a stream and by the wildlife pond.

Reduce your water consumption with a FREE Water Audit!


If you are a Stratford Utility customer, you can check out how much water you are using by looking at the "average usage" on your water bill. If you are a household of two, using more than 500 litres per day is a lot!

As a Stratford resident who pays a quarterly water bill, you are eligible for a free, in-home water

audit that will tell you everything you need to know about your current water use (things like, how much water your faucets and toilets use) and how to reduce your consumption. The audit will also let you know if you have any water leaks, which are often not visible and can go undetected.

Citizens on Patrol–Stratford (COPS) is a volunteer program designed to encourage residents of Stratford to contribute to the safety of their community. Volunteers are proud to support the excellent work of RCMP members in Stratford, by serving as an "extra set of eyes and ears" and reporting any observed suspicious activity. Committed to crime prevention, COPS volunteers patrol by car, in pairs, in residential and business areas for one or two three-hour shifts a month on Friday and Saturday nights. COPS will also patrol on occasions such as prom nights and Halloween, and support Town of Stratford events and safety initiatives. To be eligible to participate in the program, COPS volunteers must be at least eighteen years of age, undergo a criminal record check, and complete an orientation of two evenings of supervised patrolling. RCMP IN STRATFORD

RCMP encourages all Stratford residents to slow down, move over, think of others.

As they say, "the signs are everywhere" with visual reminders of your responsibilities towards safety in our community.

RCMP work closely with the Town of Stratford to promote safe habits; be it behind the wheel of a vehicle, on a bike or on foot. Each one of us has a role to play in creating a safe community by living by the words we promote. With more and more people out on the roads, sidewalks, and trails, it is important to pay attention to safety.

Slow down: Give yourself extra time so that you do not have to rush. If the traffic is slower than usual, you will have a buffer. Remember, it is not a race. You might think it is fine to speed, but getting a ticket is not going to make your day better - just slow down.

Move over: Pay attention to the roadways around you. If you see someone on the side of the road and you have room, be polite and move over. Remember, it is summer and there is likely to be people riding their bikes, kids playing, or people walking their dogs around you. So, if you can, move over and give everyone some room. If you see lights and sirens, getting out of the way can be a matter of life and death – consider this, if help were on the way to you, you would appreciate others getting out of the way so they can reach you faster.

Think of others: Following steps one and two shows that you think of others. If you were in their shoes (or on their bikes, or in their cars), how would you like to be treated? If we can all take a bit of time and be careful and considerate on the roads, we will have a community that thinks of others, and you will be one of them.

The Town of Stratford and the RCMP ask that residents report speeding issues directly to the Stratford RCMP by calling 902-367-9300.

Details such as license plate numbers, name of businesses displayed on company vehicles, color of vehicle, brand of vehicle, addresses, names, time of day etc. all help the RCMP solve speeding issues.

TIPS FOR A NATURALLY HEALTHY LAWN



The following are some tips for maintaining a healthy lawn:

Grass clippings left on your lawn supplies much needed food for your lawn.
Mulch those clipping and leave them there.

Keep your mower blade sharp. This will make mowing easier and reduce tearing the blades of grass, which can promote lawn diseases.

Aerate your lawn every couple of years to eliminate thatch and allow air, nutrients, and water to penetrate deep into the root zone.

Add grass seed to your lawn any time that bare spots begin to show.

Use an organic, slow-release fertilizer to feed your lawn.
These materials break down slowly continuing to feed your lawn over time.

Clover in your lawn is not a bad thing. It is drought tolerant and stays green, plus earth worms love it and they are an important component of a healthy lawn!

Signs have been installed near Kelly's Pond to ensure compliance with the dumping of invasive species like goldfish and Canada waterweed from aquariums. These are harmful to our native species

and their required habitat. Thanks to the PEI Invasive Species Council for installing the signs!






