### MAYOR'S MESSAGE



AS SPRING TURNS INTO SUMMER, we welcome longer days, warmer sunshine and, with a collective sigh of relief, the fading of the pandemic. In the words of Dr. Heather Morrison, a huge thank you to all Stratford residents for being so kind and patient over the past two years.

Since my last update, I am happy to report that several Town initiatives have advanced significantly:

- Regarding the new High School and Community Campus, funding has been secured to construct the roads, active transportation network, water, sewer, and stormwater systems, as well as a solar array. Work is underway to complete this infrastructure work in the current year. Further information is provided on page 4 of this newsletter.
- With the decommissioning of the former wastewater lagoons, the Michael Thomas Waterfront Park is taking shape and beginning to transform into a beautiful green space. We are currently in the design phase for the construction of a boardwalk that we hope to have completed by the end of the fall.
- Work is underway to restore Kelly's Pond to its former pristine beauty by dredging and improving water quality and flow.
- A new water tower is being constructed to meet the fresh water needs of our growing Town.
- The Switch Stratford program continues to be phenomenally successful as more and more homeowners are taking advantage of zero interest long term financing that the program provides to install greener, more cost-effective energy alternatives.
- The Town and Utility 2022-2023 Budgets were approved with no tax or utility rate increases.

The Gray Group's Crossroads development is moving forward with a great deal of new residential and commercial construction planning to take place. To support the Town's expanding residential and commercial base, the Province is constructing a new road to connect MacKinnon Drive to the Trans-Canada Highway as well as a new roundabout to facilitate efficient and safe access to the schools on Glen Stewart Drive

Our Town is thriving, as indicated by the 2022 Census that shows a growth rate of over 12 percent since 2016. We are attracting many new businesses, all of which contribute greatly to the Town. Please continue to Think Stratford! by supporting our local businesses as much as possible. Doing so helps sustain jobs and boosts the overall health of our commercial sector.

I am very grateful to Council, staff, and residents as we work together to minimize environmental impacts while maximizing opportunities to make Stratford a better place to live, work and play.

### INFRASTRUCTURE DEPARTMENT



Sump pumps should not be connected to the municipal sewer system as stated in the Town's Water & Sewer Customer Service Regulations Bylaw.

It is prohibited to discharge storm water, ground water, water used for heating and cooling etc. into the sanitary sewer system. Considering the cost associated with the treatment of sewage, avoiding unnecessary discharge that does not require treatment is both cost effective and efficient to the Town and residents.

#### > Utility Projects

#### SUBDIVISIONS

Developers in Stratford are required to install sewer and water systems during development, and when tested and approved, the Stratford Utility takes over the systems. The Utility recently took over infrastructure of three subdivisions for 140 serviced units when fully developed. These summer extensions are proposed in Clearview Estates, Kelly Heights, MacKinnon Drive, and Foxwood Flourish while several other developments are in the concept phase.

#### SEWER LIFT STATION UPGRADES

This summer, the Utility will replace a portion of the sewer forcemain on Kinlock Road with a larger diameter pipe and upgrade pumps at the sewer lift station located at the Kinlock/ Keppoch Road intersection.

#### WATER RESERVOIR PROJECT

The Utility has budgeted for an additional water storage reservoir to be located beside the existing reservoir on the Georgetown Rd. Utility will soon tender for the design of this work.

Stratford Utility will add additional hydrants in the core commercial area, install fencing around our wells at Pondside, provide shorefront protection on Bayside Dr for our sewer lift station, add lightning protection at

our water stations, and continue our Inflow & Infiltration plan to reduce exterior storm water flows into our sewer system.

Please note that it is illegal to discharge any storm water, surface water, water from sump pumps, roof run-off, surface drainage, subsurface drainage, foundation drainage, or water used for heating or cooling into our sewer system.

### > Public Works

Staff are busy with spring grass cutting, property and building maintenance, installing and relocating temporary speed humps, maintaining trails, and other daily duties. Energy retrofits will take place at the Cotton Park youth/seniors building, and solar panels installed at Stratford Emergency Services Center and the maintenance building at Stratford Town Centre. Parking lot paving will take place this year at Stratford Town Centre and Cotton Park. Other work planned for this year include having the electric car charging station on Shepard Drive upgraded to a pay as you go unit, the storage barn at Cotton Park relocated to allow for more parking spaces, the purchase of an electric car to add to the Town fleet, along with a maintenance truck and small work tractor. A steel roof will be added to the soccer complex building located between the soccer fields in the 2022 vear as well.

#### ACTIVE TRANSPORTATION

The existing sidewalk from Pondside to Woodlane Drive will be replaced this year and a marsh lookout deck will be installed at Bellevue Cove along the new paved multi-purpose path this year. The Town has partnered with Stratford and Area Watershed Improvement Group to complete this work. The general location of the

lookout deck is indicated by the white star ( $\star$ ) in the map below.

Pending funding, the Town will partner with the Province to install a paved multi-purpose path on Kinlock Road from the Sobeys intersection to JK Beauty Lane.

As part of the roundabout development and road extension to MacKinnon Drive, the Province and developer will partner to install paved active transportation paths from MacKinnon Drive to the new roundabout and on the Trans-Canada Highway, from the Sobeys intersection to the underpass. We thank the Province and developer for supporting our active transportation plans.

#### SPEED SIGNS/SPEED HUMPS

In our ongoing effort to reduce speeding in Stratford, the Town continues to purchase speed radar signs and speed humps. This year the Town has initiated a new process for requesting a temporary speed hump. A written request will need to be filled out by the person making the request and there are guidelines that must be met for final approval. Further information can be found on our website or by calling us at 902-569-1995.

### TOWN ROADS STREET AND DITCH INFILLING

All roads, streets and ditches in Stratford are owned by the Province of PEI. Provincial crews are already cleaning up from winter plow, salt, and storm water damage. They are also busy patching potholes and installing or replacing culverts.

Please note that any request to infill your ditch or replace a raised culvert can be directed to the Provincial Department of Highways.





In the last couple of years, the Town of Stratford, in collaboration with the RCMP, has installed digital radar signs in various areas of the Town to deter speeding and help keep our community safe. We continue to also use our portable radar signs around the community as well. Here are some interesting facts about the data collected:

- We now have 8 radar signs across Town. These are located on Mason Rd, Bunbury Rd, Kinlock Rd, Rosebank Rd, Keppoch Rd, Georgetown Rd, Shakespeare Dr, and Stratford Rd.
- In 2020, we had 2,649,128 vehicles drive past seven of these signs
- Throughout 2021, we recorded a total of 3,579,584 vehicles drive past the eight signs.

The data collected from our signs is shared with the Town, RCMP and Provincial Transportation and Infrastructure staff and includes details such as day of the week and time of day of occurrences, speeds of travel, number of vehicles, etc. and is used to indicate where problem areas are. This data can then be used to increase patrols or to make more permanent changes to the area such as permanent speed humps, or in the future possibly photo radar or other technology which the Province of PEI has indicated an intent to explore.

Remember to "Slow down, move over, and think of others" when driving. Speeding is one of the main causes of road accidents and by staying within posted limits, you are helping keep your families and community safe.

The Town of Stratford has many types of zoning areas. Find out about them and their respective codes below:

> **R1**: Low Density Residential Zone

**R1L**: Low Density Residential Large Lot

**R2**: Medium Density Residential Zone

**R3**: Multiple Unit Residential Zone

**PURD**: Planned Unit Residential Development Zone

**C1**: General Commercial Zone

**C2**: Highway Commercial Zone

M2: Business Park Zone

A1: Agricultural Reserve Zone

**O1**: Recreation and Open Space Zone

**O2**: Environmental Reserve Zone

### > The Building Bylaw and National Building Code

In the spring of 2020, the Town of Stratford adopted a new Building Bylaw (Bylaw #50), which included the adoption of the 2015 National Building Code and the 2017 National Energy Code of Canada for Buildings The Building Bylaw is enforced through scheduled inspections during construction at various stages of completion. These inspections will verify work against the approved submitted plans and against the NBCC.

Any new application for a single detached development requires the following information:

- Development Application Form
- Utility Application Form
- Entrance Way Application Form
- Completed Deck Pamphlet (if using Helical Piles, an engineer stamped helical pile design is required)
- Building Plans; including, floor plans, elevations, and cross-section
- Truss Package; including, layouts and individual truss design
- Site Plan/Grading Plan
- Letter of Authorization
- Additional information may be required

\*\*\* Please note that preliminary plans will no longer be accepted \*\*\*

To ensure that your permit is ready in time for your project start date, please submit your complete application as early as possible, while allowing enough time for staff to process it.

### > Bylaw information

### > Official Plan Review Update

Now that Stratford Town Council have adopted the Stratford Waterfront Core Area Plan, Town staff are working to

review the recommended changes to the Town's Official Plan and Zoning Bylaw.

The Waterfront Core Area and Town Centre Core Area are both proposing

changes from the original proposal that was put forward by the Core Area Plan completed in 2006. As a result, it is now recommended that the Town review the Mason Road Core Area as part of the 2021 Official Plan Review.

This would ensure that any revisions that may be necessary to complement proposed changes in the remaining core area are completed at the same time. There would be emphasis on areas that could contain mixed use rather than exclusively commercial or residential development.

Public consultation on proposed changes to the Official Plan is expected to take place in 2022.

### > Development Permit Processing Time

As the Town experiences yet another busy development season, we would like to notify applicants that permit processing times have been extended to 2-4 weeks from the time the completed application is submitted. The Planning Department will continue to work diligently to expedite permits. If you have any questions regarding permit applications, please reach out to us at 902-569-6255.

### DID YOU KNOW?

Any outdoor pool with a depth of 60 cm (24 inches) or more, or with a surface area exceeding 10 square metres, whether being constructed or purchased as an inflatable kit, and that is intended for swimming/bathing, requires a development permit from the Town.

A fence of 1.8 m (6 ft.) is also required to be constructed so as to prevent unauthorized persons from entering over and under the fence. Any gate on the fence has to

be self closing/self latching.

### AWARD OBJECTIVES

Volunteers are - and always will be - an essential part of our community. This award is an annual award, which acknowledges and rewards a volunteer citizen who has made an outstanding contribution to our community.

The recipient will receive prizes (to be determined by Town Council) and the recipient will have his or her picture displayed at Stratford Town Center. The winner's name will also be engraved on a special trophy to honor each year's Volunteer of the Year. ALL NOMINEES will be recognized for their volunteer efforts and will receive an official acknowledgement on behalf of the Town of Stratford.

### ELIGIBILITY

Volunteering is the act of people being involved in the improvement of their surroundings. Volunteer acts can occur within a structured organization (ex. volunteering at your library) or in an informal setting (ex. raking leaves for your elderly neighbor).

Those eligible to receive this award include any individual who performs volunteer act/acts (as defined above) within the Town of Stratford community. The purpose of this award is to focus on recognizing individual citizens; however the judging committee will also accept a submission that nominates two or more people together.

### SELECTION PROCESS

The Town of Stratford will oversee the award, provide title, and the way in which it is presented. A committee under the direction of the Town's Recreation Committee will select the winner.

### TOWN EVENTS & INITIATIVES

#### > Feed the Bees



Stratford has partnered with the PEI Beekeepers Association again this year to give out free 'Pardon the weeds, we are feeding the bees' signs to residents to put in their yards for the month of May and early June to promote reduced mowing and growth of dandelions to support our very important pollinator species – bees! Keep an eye out for these signs around the community and commit to helping us feed the bees!



### > Switch Stratford

Our Switch Stratford program, launched in July 2021, has been very successful so far! Through this program, Stratford homeowners can get 0% financing for energy efficiency upgrades up to a cap of 15% of the assessed property value or \$40,000, whichever is lower. Please note 0% financing will only be available for a limited time. PACE Atlantic facilitates the program for the Town of Stratford and provides residents with one-on-one support through the entirety of their project. So far, we have committed over \$1 million in project loans to Stratford residents, with even more to come! The Switch Stratford program aligns with the Town's sustainability goals and is helping us reduce our greenhouse gas emissions as a community. This project is funded by the Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM).

#### > Climate Trackers

The Town of Stratford has partnered with the City of Charlottetown to gather 'Climate Trackers' in each of our communities to help us collect data about our climate. We are collecting data about agriculture, plants and animals, weather, and local climate change impacts like flooding and erosion. Workshops are being held in May for volunteers to learn about the origin of the project, signs of spring, invasive species, and climate change. Check our website and social media for workshop details and most importantly, to register to become a Climate Tracker!

#### > Residential Tree Planting Program

In an effort to increase Stratford's forest canopy, the Residential Tree Planting Program is continuing for 2022. Trees

in your yard have many benefits, including increased property value, shade and wind buffering, privacy, and air purification, to name a few. We have nearly



50 residents registered to receive low cost, good quality, native species trees this year. Registration closed in mid-March, and we are planting the trees in May!

### > Water Conservation

Protecting our freshwater resource is important to support our growing community. The Town of Stratford has water conservation programs that residents can take advantage of to check for leaks and replace old toilets and showerheads. You can sign up for a free Water Audit to identify your water consumption and increase efficiency. We have a toilet rebate available, where residents can receive \$50 per toilet when replacing a highflow toilet with a new low-flow toilet, up to a maximum of 2 toilets. We also have a showerhead exchange program where residents can bring in old high-flow showerheads and receive

up to 2 new low-flow showerheads free of charge. We deliver these programs in partnership with the Stratford Area Watershed Improvement Group (SAWIG).



### > Kellys Pond Watershed Restoration

The Town has been approved for funding through the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program's (ICIP) Green Infrastructure stream for restoration of the Kelly's Pond-Moore's Pond watershed system. The integrity of the Kelly's Pond-Moore's Pond watershed is currently compromised by undersized water control structures, sediment infilling, degraded wetlands, and inadequate buffer zones. Restoring this system will mitigate the effects of extreme weather events and climate change as well as provide a healthy habitat for local wildlife.


Restoration work will take place in 2022 and will be completed in collaboration with the Stratford Area Watershed Improvement Group (SAWIG).

#### > Permissions to use Town Facilities

Groups and individuals who want to use Town facilities (which includes parks, playgrounds, and playing fields) for any reason must fill out an application and obtain permission from the recreation department. Town parks include all neighborhood parks and playgrounds as well as our major parks; Tea Hill Park, Pondside Park, Kinlock Park, Robert L. Cotton Memorial Park, and Fullerton's Creek Conservation Park. Town facilities include Stratford **Emergency Services Centre, Stratford** Town Centre, MacNeill Community Centre, Bunbury Rink Building and Cotton Park buildings. Town facilities are available to groups or individuals on a priority basis.

### > Town Centre Gymnasium

The Stratford Town Centre is open for Stratford residents to use seven days a week. The centre is equipped with a gymnasium, walking track, fitness centre, multi-purpose meeting rooms, change rooms, stage, and kitchen. Residents are welcome to use the gymnasium during scheduled open gym times. Schedules are posted online at *www.townofstratford.ca*.

To book any of our meeting rooms or gymnasium for private use, please contact the recreation office at 902569-6250. We ask that you please sign in and out with the gym attendants when using our facility.

### > Stratford Gymnasium Track Direction and Rules

Lanes at the track are for walking and running. Directions for walking/running change daily – these are posted everyday by the entrance to the track. We ask that people do not walk more than two people wide in the walking lane so that faster walkers may pass in the outside lane (running lane) when traffic allows. Indoor footwear is required.

Young children MUST be directly supervised by an adult if using the gymnasium track. Fitness area (equipment only) is restricted to those 15 years and older.

#### > Scent-free

July 16-17 Watershed Weekend SAWIG is a not-for-profit group dedicated to preserving and enhancing Stratford's diverse landscape and fostering interest and participation in watershed planning.

We held our **Annual Building Better Backyards for Birds** series this March, funded in part by the PEI Wildlife Conservation Fund. This year, our project resulted in the assembly of 30 bird feeders and 40 bird houses.

The goal of this project is to increase food sources for birds during the coldest part of the year, to create nesting habitat for local birds, and increase education about bird species and threats to birds in the Stratford area.



### > Summer Field Season Wrap up

This summer SAWIG students are very busy! Over 1,200 trees are being planted along streams and coastlines, 26 bags of bittersweet nightshade were removed from riparian zones, 8 beaches were cleaned twice, and 6 brush mats were installed to help remove sediment from the stream to improve fish habitat. Also, water quality monitoring took place weekly in ten locations. Overall, it has been another successful field season!



Between March 28 and April 8, SAWIG, the Town of Stratford, and the City of Charlottetown collaborated to run the **WaterSchool education program**. This year we had almost 500 students attend from schools in Stratford, Charlottetown, Donagh, and Vernon River!



This spring, **six new interpretive signs** will be installed at Fullerton's Creek Conservation Park funded in part by Wildlife Habitat Canada. Watch our social media for an announcement of the grand opening!

• Some of the most important festivals include Holi (also known as the festival of colours), the spectacular 11-day festival of Ganesh Chaturthi, the 9 nights of Navratri, Diwali (also known as the festival of lights), Onam, and Vaisakhi among

• Cricket is the most popular sport. Other popular sports in India are hockey, wrestling, soccer, badminton, and chess.

• Indians are strongly guided by their respective religions and shared values. Respect for elders and impor-

tance on family and community are core values that make up the Indian society.

• India is relatively a conservative society and Indians greet each other with a 'namaste', by folding their palms together and a slight bow out of respect.

• In formal situations or with people they don't know very well, Indians generally use honorifics such as "Sir," or "Madam." So, don't be surprised if they hesitate to call you by your first name when you are first introduced.

• Indians are also very expressive in their body language. They use a lot of hand gestures and sometimes move their head sideways with a slight tilt that is interpreted as a "no" by others, when in fact, the gesture is meant as a "yes", "sounds good", or it indicates that a person is listening and paying attention.

• Indians often eat with their hand. If you walk into a restaurant and find someone eating with their hand, don't be surprised. You may even want to give it a try – according to them, the food tastes better this way!

• Many Indians are vegetarian and many that aren't will not consume beef, which they consider to be sacred. So, if you're bringing them a gift, stay away from meat to be safe.

### STRATFORD COMMUNITY CAMPUS UPDATE

### Where are we today?

The purchase of the land last year was a major milestone for our community to start moving towards a campus which will, in time, include a variety of sport, recreational and cultural amenities. This past winter a lease agreement was signed with Island Gymnastics Academy with plans to construct their new facility on the Community Campus, subject to their receipt of funding to assist in doing so. Other similar partnerships are at early stages of consideration, as well as amenities which will be owned and operated by the Town of Stratford, and the construction of the new Stratford High School by the Province of PEI, all of which will enhance the overall property and compliment one another as they are developed.

This spring, the federal and provincial governments, along with the Town of Stratford, announced joint funding which is allowing for the

design and construction to move forward this year of the required roads and trails; water and sewer; electrical distribution; and a solar array to offset our energy outputs to be a net zero campus and help us meet our Community Energy Plan targets.

Also, this spring the Town of Stratford issued a Request For

Proposals to look at a fundraising feasibility study for the community. Fundraising was identified by residents through the 2021 longterm budget exercise as a supported means to help with the construction of required facilities on the Community Campus, and the study is currently ongoing.



#### > More information

A Community Campus Master Plan is in the final stages of development. This plan was developed through

consultation with the public, staff and council, as well as looking at our anticipated needs, best practices, and working within the most effective and efficient means using the natural topography of the land to the extent possible. This plan will be available on the Town's website for residents to view once it is adopted by Council.

#### > Next Steps

The Town of Stratford continues to hold conversations with various sport and cultural organizations who have expressed interest in being a part of the Community Campus as it develops. These will continue and construction of amenities will occur as opportunities present themselves through funding or partnerships, and alignment is found with needs and goals of our community. The campus is anticipated to operate with a mix of public-private partnerships, privately run operations, and municipally operated elements with the overall development of the Community Campus occurring in phases over many years.

### > Stratford High School Update


Work is well underway for the new Stratford High School. The new Stratford High school will meet the needs of a growing community and support safe student learning for years to come.

Construction of the new high school will start in the spring of 2023. This new state of the art high school should be ready to welcome students and staff in September 2025.

The Stratford High School Construction Planning Committee began meeting in January 2021 and completed the new High School's Space Program in December 2021.

Nine Yards Studio is the Prime Consult for the project, working in partnership with Architecture49. The building design work is now underway with the building being designed for a population of 750 students and will be a Net-Zero Ready building. A huge thank you to all of the parents, community members, educators and students who have been part of the planning process so far. When the design work is complete, the province will host an information session for all parents and community members to view the proposed plans and provide feedback.







### NEW CAO AT THE TOWN OF STRATFORD!

We're pleased to welcome Jeremy Crosby as the new Chief Administrative Officer (CAO) of the Town! Prior to his appointment, Jeremy Crosby was employed for 17 years as the Town's Director of Infrastructure and as the Deputy CAO. ### Reasons for Optimism!

I would like to bring to your attention some encouraging signs for Stratford residents and all Islanders that the trials and tribulations of the past 3 years, have also included moments of formal recognition of personal achievements and significant government decisions which serve to generate much needed optimism for our collective future.

#### Stratford Infrastructure Funding Announcement

In early April, I was honoured to represent the Provincial Government at an announcement of tri level government funding secured for Stratford infrastructure projects, including water and sewage development at the much-anticipated Community Campus, and required restoration work of Kelly's Pond-Moore's Pond watershed system. 3 levels of government have committed to a combined grant of \$15 million: Federal = \$6+ million; Provincial = \$5 million; Town of Stratford = \$4+ million.

#### **Covid Warrior Coin Award**

Following the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic, Stratford resident, Dr. Trevor Jain, who is also an emergency physician, took the initiative to propose an award in recognition of the hard work and dedication of people and organizations who have gone "above and beyond" in their efforts to offset the resulting disruption of required services.

The award has been named the Covid Warrior Coin and is granted by PEI's Lieutenant Governor. As a long-time regular blood donor, I had no hesitation nominating the employees and volunteers of the Canada Blood Services, Charlottetown Centre for consideration, and was

thrilled to learn they had been selected to be one of the first recipients of the 'Coin'! I had the distinct honour of presenting the award at the Centre on behalf of her Honour, Antoinette Perry.

### MICHELE BEATON, MLA

It is so nice to see everything greening up and the flowers blooming, hear the birds chirping, and seeing families get outside to enjoy springtime activities. Nicer weather is upon us, and I think we are all looking forward to a beautiful PEI summer!

The Spring sitting of the Legislature has been a busy one for me. I had the opportunity to move several motions which initiated debate on important topics impacting Islanders.



For example, there are often daily occurrences when limited or no ambulances are available to respond to 911 calls in PEI. We all heard recent news about the lack of ambulance services that have led to tragic results. For years, paramedics have been raising concerns about the level of service delivered by Island EMS which is privately owned by Medavie Health Services. Therefore, I introduced a motion to urge government to prepare a strategic plan to transition paramedicine services to the public healthcare system. Islanders and paramedics deserve better than a private company that serves its shareholders instead of the public. However, the PCs and Liberals seem to be okay with the current system. Both parties voted against this motion.

I pressed hard to improve the retention of healthcare workers in the province. This is an issue that must be addressed. We have a shortage in human resources. We need to invest in those that are currently working in healthcare. Hence, I moved a motion to remove financial barriers to enter healthcare professions. The motion called for government to provide free and accelerated training for nursing staff (RCW, LPN, and RN) on PEI to enter the healthcare system and upskill their expertise. Providing a professional development path for healthcare workers is an investment in the future of all Islanders.

I also called on government to improve safety and security of healthcare workers, invest in childcare spaces that meet the reality of the shift work of these workers, and to invest in upstream mental health initiatives. These kinds of investments will alleviate some of the immediate pressures that healthcare workers are experiencing.

I continue to volunteer with the Stratford Brownies, Stratford and Area Lions, and Birchwood Breakfast Program. If you can, I encourage you to reach out to the organizations in our community to share your time. Volunteering is a wonderful way to meet new people and help others in the community.

I'd like to give a big shout out to volunteers at the Crossroads Fire Department for giving the Stratford Sparks and Brownies a tour of a lifetime. They demonstrated the ladder truck and let the girls try the water hose! It was a great experience for everyone.

# FEED THE BEES

Often considered a weed, we ask residents to consider not digging up or spraying dandelions as they are an important food source for bees through May and June.



Consider extending the period between mowing during these months while staying within the Town of Stratford's Bylaw, and keeping grass under 8" tall.



Citizens on Patrol–Stratford (COPS) is a volunteer program designed to encourage residents of Stratford to contribute to the safety of their community. Volunteers are proud to support the excellent work of RCMP members in Stratford, by serving as an "extra set of eyes and ears" and reporting any observed suspicious activity. Committed to crime prevention, COPS volunteers patrol by car, in pairs, in residential and business areas for one or two three-hour shifts a month on Friday and Saturday nights. COPS will also patrol on occasions such as prom nights and Halloween, and support Town of Stratford events and safety initiatives. To be eligible to participate in the program, COPS volunteers must be at least eighteen years of age, undergo a criminal record check, and complete an orientation of two evenings of supervised patrolling.
